## Did You Know?

You Must Apply and Obtain a Permit from the City of Burleson to Conduct a Garage Sale

The City's Instructions (at the URL below) concerning Garage Sales, state, in part:

"As defined in Section 66-31 of the Burleson Texas Code of Ordinances, a garage sale is the sale of tangible personal property or used or unwanted household items that is held in the garage, driveway or yard of the seller's residence; ...... The term garage sale includes the terms yard sale, estate sale, occasional sale, and similar terms

In order to receive a permit to conduct a yard/garage sale, this form must be submitted to the City of Burleson Building Permit office. Upon receipt, your application will be reviewed and an email will be sent that will provide your permit number or the reason why a permit cannot be issued."

In other words, anyone wishing to conduct a "garage sale" must submit an application electronically to the City. You may also visit the Building Permit office at City Hall, to make application and obtain your permit number. You must purchase your own "garage sale" sign, in the size dictated by the City.

Note: The number of garage sales on a property shall not exceed two during any calendar year period from January 1 to December 31. The duration of each sale shall not exceed three consecutive calendar days.
